THEIR STORY

Federico was born in the Canary Islands and came from a Christian family. He accepted Christ as his Savior at the age of nine, and at the age of 17, he began to serve in the youth ministry. At 25, he decided to study at Sefovan Seminary, where Ken Muckle taught. There, he met his wife, Lucía, and they were married in 2007.

Lucía was born in the former Czechoslovakia in a militant, atheist, and communist family. Her parents taught her that human beings had the capacity to achieve a just and good world, but in their home, they suffered a lot of violence, alcoholism, and problems with the law due to fraud and scams. Having traveled to Spain, she, her mother, and brother met an evangelical pastor with whom she began to study the Bible and converted when she was 15 years old. Right away, she felt a very deep burden to share Christ with others so they could have the same healing and hope that she experienced.

Fede and Lucia have four children, Andrea born in 2009, Eva in 2010, Veronica in 2012, and Simon in 2016. Fede and Lucia work as church planters in Cabanillas del Campo. Fede is the pastor of the church. Lucia organizes and teaches the children's and teen programs. Together they do a lot of counseling with their church members, who are all first-generation Christians.
